CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE LICENSE

The Commission received the Granted Advisory Recommendation from Powhattan Township for the Sac & Fox Truck Stop. The license for cereal malt beverages was signed.

COVID-19

The commission opened the floor to public comment. Kendra Heinen, stated that she is 100% no masks. One size fits all is not appropriate in Kansas. She is in favor of opening the schools and trying to keep life as normal as possible.

WILLDAN

Brent Ragsdale, Willdan, updated the commission on the current conditions of the heating and cooling at the jail. Recommendations are to upgrade the HVAC system and add additional features to the rooftop along with replacing lighting to current LED standards. Estimated cost of the project is \$970,000 - \$1,140,000.

COVID-19

Randy Garber, Kansas State Representaive, was available to answer questions about decisions being made at the state level. Commissioner Olsen asked if the county could override Governor Kelly's decision. Garber stated that more information was forthcoming.

COVID-19

Brown County Attorney, Kevin Hill, was available by phone. In order for the commission to override the Governor's Orders, the commission needs to consult with the county health official.

BROWN COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Kristina Romine, was available to speak with the commission regarding the executive order from Governor Kelly. Romine stated that the order left it up to the counties.

Hill again stated the commission needs to consult with the county health official and local medical providers before making a decision. Romine stated they would facilitate a meeting with medical staff from Horton and Hiawatha.

COVID-19

Motion by Keith Olsen to leave the county as is until Monday to give the commission time to research with local health officials. Seconded by Richard Lehmkuhl. Motion carried.

Randy Garber said it was unfortunate that the state government overstepped their boundaries but felt fortunate that the decision was left to local officials.

ROAD & BRIDGE

Julie Liberty, Road and Bridge Secretary, presented the final report for Streambank Revitalization on 290th Street. She also discussed other projects she has been working on.

Don Pounds, Emergency Manager, presented Resolution 2020-13, the SPARK proposal to distribute \$1,939,142 to Brown County to help address the health and economic challenges due to COVID-19. The deadline to spend the money is August 15, 2020.

TREASURER

Brown County Treasurer, Cheryl Lippold, stated she would continue to run her office as she has been. There will continue to be a limit to the number of people in her office at one time, and she will continue to use the card system.

COVID-19

The commission spoke with Mary Oswald and asked her to stay on for another 30 days to continue to screen people at the door.

ROAD & BRIDGE

Commissioner Lehmkuhl stated he had received a call from USD #415 about oiling the parking lot. They needed the county to complete construction to a new parking lot. The commission recommends USD #415 to contact the City of Hiawatha.
