ROAD FOREMAN

This consists of seven studio apartments with family style dining. BCDS also rents fourteen apartments from the Plaza Apartments and two apartments from Maple Winds. Lock reported on the BCDS Thrift Shop. BCDS helps 43 adults and 13 children.
