signatures at the June 20, 2005 Commissioner meeting, with bids on the Feasibility Study being returned by June 30, 2005.

Steve Roberts volunteered to be on the steering committee, representing Brown County.

FREEDOM FUEL ENHANCER

Dale Salts, Freedom Fuel Enhancer, presented information on his fuel additive/cleanser product.

APPRAISER

Appraiser Tom Brown discussed the tax status of properties outside the Tribal Reservations. Brown will write a letter expressing Brown County's concerns.

BG CONSULTANTS

Tom Bennett, BG Consultants, reported on the CDBG Grants. These grants are available for low to medium income entities. Brown County's qualifying townships would be Irving, Robinson, Mission and Powhattan. The Commissioners and Road Foremen will select projects for the grant applications, which must be submitted by October 2005. Also discussed was the letter received from the State of Kansas regarding past water structure permits. Various other road projects were discussed.
